### Global Partnership for Development (GPDP)

Project Description	As an emerging 'donor of the South', Thailand is increasingly reaching out to other developing countries in support of human development and poverty reduction. In 2005, Thailand produced an MDG 8 report, the first time a country outside of the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) to do so. The report outlined the contribution of Thailand to the global partnership for development through development cooperation, improving market access for import from least developed countries, and foreign direct investment in neighbouring countries. The project will support the Government of Thailand, through TICA, in following up on the recommendations of the Thailand MDG 8 and the implementation of the Paris Declaration on Aid Effectiveness to which Thailand is a signatory country (5 March 2005). Specifically, the project aims to build capacity of TICA and other line ministries concerned on ODA data management, monitoring and evaluation processes, as well as to support new innovative approaches to South-South Cooperation of Thailand with other countries in the region and beyond.
