<p>Project Description</p>	<p>The project will contribute to Mine Action initiatives to assist the Royal Thai Government to meet its Ottawa Treaty obligations and reduce risks of vulnerable groups leading to improved livelihoods in targeted areas.</p> <p>The project will focus on enhancing capacities of Thailand Mine Action Centre (TMAC) and relevant government agencies to collect accurate and up-to-date disaggregated data, for policy planning and priority setting purposes. The project also aims to minimize immediate safety threats for local communities, promote participation by local authorities and communities and increase their sense of ownership of mine awareness and risk management. It is also hoped that the project will contribute to an increase in Thailand's capacity to meet the obligations of the Ottawa Mine Ban Convention..</p> <p>In 1998 Thailand ratified the Ottawa Convention banning the use, stockpiling, production and transfer to anti-personnel landmines. Therefore, Thailand remains committed to meet the obligations stipulated in the Convention.</p>
